Rabbi Marc's Message

Summer and Israel

Just a short time ago, I received in my email inbox my daily dose of ReformJudaism.org's Ten Minutes of Torah. I was sad to see that one of

my favorite contributors, Rabbi Marc Rosenstein, was writing his last column for a while. Many of you already know that for many years he has been writing *The Galilee Diary*. Even before I had an idea of making the transition from engineer to rabbi, I was captivated by his engaging descriptions of Israeli life and his approach to spirituality, religion, history, community, food and politics.

When I spent my first year of rabbinical school in Israel, my classmates and I had the great privilege to travel to Moshav Shorashim. There Rabbi Rosenstein had created the Galilee Circus where young Jews and Arabs come together to learn circus arts while breaking down barriers that often keep them apart. This still stands out from the hundreds, maybe thousands, of things that filled me with hope for Israel, the Jewish people, and even the world during that year.

I had never been to Israel before spending the year there in 2011-12. Picking up and moving to any foreign country for a year is a daunting task which takes months of preparation. I remember thinking in the months leading up – ok, I'll go, I'll come back, no big deal. I could not have been further off base. It hit me like a ton of bricks on the sheirut (van) ride from Ben Gurion to Jerusalem. Looking out the window as the Sharon Plains gave way to the Judean Hills, I did cry. I was overwhelmed by an undeniable sense of connection to a land that I had never before seen. The engineer in me found this totally illogical. The rabbi in me said, of course! There is an undeniable beauty to Israel that has captivated me since. I am forever changed by my time in Israel.

My last trip to Israel this past November with my newly ordained colleagues was very challenging. The trip was organized by Hebrew Union College and the Israel Ministry of Foreign Affairs. It was meant to be challenging. As rabbis and cantors, we are necessarily unofficial ambassadors for Israel in our local communities. The College and the Ministry brought us to Israel, just as we were entering our first congregational positions. It was designed to give us an opportunity to further develop our own authentic view of Israel, as it is, with all of its challenges and all of its radiance.

We are very lucky in our community to have one of Israel's best ambassadors, Jerry Fischer. Under his leadership and the loving guidance of Marcia Reinhard, we are also blessed to have two young emissaries join our community each year. They all help bring Israel here to us in Eastern CT. But there is nothing like going there. Jerry has led too many missions to Israel to count. Jerry's knowledge and first hand engagement with Israeli life and culture is a blessing to our community that makes each mission unique. If you have not gone on one of Jerry's missions, you should. If you have never been to Israel, save your shekels, it will change you.

Jerry and I have been speaking for the past several months about a unique mission to Israel. We want to help our families with tweens and teens engage with Israel, have their own authentic relationship with Israel.

In the summer of 2018, tentatively June 26 to July 8, will be our TE/JFEC family mission to Israel open to the entire community. Having a large family myself, I know how overwhelming such a trip may seem. Jerry continues to work hard to make this mission as affordable as possible. Start saving. This can be a spiritual recharging and awakening for your family. It will provide you and your children with your own authentic view of our homeland. Israel will captivate you.

Mark your calendars for Tuesday, September 12 at 6:30PM for an informational meeting where we will discuss the itinerary and costs. Pizza, salad and drinks will be served. I look forward to seeing you at the meeting and traveling with you.

His timing and his words make us cringe, but I can sympathize with another President's impulse to tweet.

We are a congregation existing in exciting but uncertain times. The sale of Beth El's building offers Temple Emanu-El opportunities and challenges. Potential streams of rental revenue come with opening our home to other Jewish organizations. Do we fight for our identity so hard that we alienate ourselves from the other congregations in New London County? We have also been presented with challenges to support less capable organizations that still serve our Jewish community. Do we turn our back on an organization in need when it's possible to help them without necessarily benefiting from it?

While I prefer to deal with these situations based on the hard facts – money and square footage – it's impossible to address these opportunities without having emotions come into the equation. Many of you feel the same way, and have written to me expressing your support, but also your own opinions on how we should deal with Beth El and Solomon Schechter. Since all of you seem to want to know what I'm thinking, maybe I should take to Twitter and share my wisdom!

It's tempting to tweet. It's tempting to answer each and every e-mail and let the sender know what I'm thinking. It's tempting to take up an argument when I hear something that I don't agree with. Every e-mail I receive, every phone call that I get, and every question sent in my direction at an Oneg is an invitation to share my wisdom. However, I'm not really all that wise; I'm just the guy who's responsible. So, every conversation I have is an opportunity for me to send mixed messages.

Naturally, the wise thing to do is to keep my mouth shut, but I know that I often fail at this. Like Tevye, I crave for my opinion to be valued, even if I don't know what I'm talking about. This is often why I talk - I want to hear what <u>you're</u> thinking. Even if I decide that I don't agree, I value your opinions and participation.

I sympathize with the other President. It's hard to be alone with your opinions when the whole world is trying to pry them from you. Having the ability to let everybody know what you're thinking at that very moment is a great temptation, but we all can see from the other President that doing that is fraught with peril. I hope you will all have the patience for me to keep my opinion to myself from time to time.

For all these things, G-d, I am grateful.

But thank you, especially, G-d, in Your abundant love, for having chosen to make me a human being, blessed, among all the fruits of Your creation, with a mind to reason and seek truth and justice; with a soul

which can feel pain, ecstasy, and compassion, and has the freedom to choose life and goodness over cruelty and destruction; and with a heart which can love and care, and reach out to touch the hearts of my brothers and sisters, as together we walk through the years of our lives.
