Rabbi's Message -Marc Ekstrand

As I'm writing this, summer has barely started. There are still a few more important things to go before my "summer" can truly begin. By the time you read this, we will have celebrated the B'nei Mitzvah of Spencer Haynes and

Owen Grant. The last student from this class, Alexis Fenton, will become a Bat Mitzvah on October 13. But, even before that, our emissary, Ziv Lavi, will be called to the Torah as a Bat Mitzvah on August 4.

Summer is a time to slow down, take a breath, and refocus. For me, it is time to focus on the coming year. I look forward with excitement to some new things that are just beginning to take shape. As we work out the details, I want to just give you a taste so that you can look forward as well.

As we did last year, our spiritual preparations for the High Holy Days will be enhanced by the use of our new prayer book, Mishkan Halev – Prayers for S'lichot and the Month of Elul. S'lichot will occur a little early this year, on Saturday evening, September 1. We'll change over our Torah mantles to the High Holy Day white at that time. Rosh Hashanah begins Sunday evening Sept. 9, and Yom Kippur, Tuesday evening Sept 18. I'm hungry for break-the-fast already!

I'm looking forward to resuming our First Fridays in the fall. Friday, October 5 will be extremely special as we honor the years of dedication of our outgoing religious school coadministrators, Barbara Kallan and Marc Goldsmith as well as many of our dedicated teachers. Make sure to join us to honor them for all that they have done for us.

First Fridays will be just a little different in the upcoming year. Starting this fall, we will begin First Friday evenings with Shir Shabbat at 5:30 P.M. This will be an interactive Kabbalat Shabbat for all ages – expect a lot of singing, clapping, instruments, and maybe even dancing. All the ruach (spirit) will make it especially friendly for everyone. It is the perfect way to set the mood for Shabbat dinner at 6pm. Have Shabbat dinner with friends and make some new ones – enjoy good food, take in the Shabbat spirit, and don't wor-

ry about the dishes! Following dinner will be a shorter evening Shabbat service beginning at 7 P.M. followed by oneg. First Fridays are the crossroads of our community. Meet us there.

Lastly, as I've mentioned several times in my weekly messages, please mark your calendars for October 26-28. That weekend, we will have two very special guests from Israel, Rabbi Or Zohar and his wife Feliza Bascara-Zohar. Based in the Galilee, they have been sharing their original sacred music for over a decade, using it as a powerful tool for bringing people together and promoting a more pluralistic and progressive society in Israel. Rabbi Or Zohar is a musician, teacher of Judaism and Kabbalah, and community builder in the Israeli Reform Movement. He serves as the rabbi of two Reform congregations in the Galilee: Ma'alot Tivon and Misgav Regional Council. Feliza Zohar is a singer-songwriter, song leader, artist and choreographer. There will be programming with Rabbi Or and Feliza throughout the weekend including a special Shabbat service on Friday evening, concert Saturday night, and teaching on Saturday and Sunday including working with our religious school students. Don't miss this. Put all of these things on your calendar. We'll remind you as well.

Ohh...and don't forget about our barbecue, outdoor service on August 10 and Bluff Point bagels and brachot on August 18

Cleveland Rocks! That was the song that welcomed the members of the Women Cantors' Network to our annual conference.

We were warmly welcomed by our host synagogue, The Temple-Tifereth Israel and given a tour of the beautiful, newly renovated, space. The Temple-Tifereth Israel is in Beach-

wood, Ohio, and sits on 21 acres of property. With the new addition, the building totals 65,000 sq. ft.

It's sanctuary seats 520 and the new chapel, 300. It has a library which holds 24,000 books, and a special room to house art work, such as the Footwear Art by Kobi Levi. You can check out these incredible whimsical shoes at https://kobilevidesign.com/ May favorite space was an outdoor venue to have services in the summer. There was much more, but you can take a look at their synagogue by going to www.tti.org.

Every morning and evening, we attended and led services in their lovely chapel. I told you at the Congregational Meeting that I was going to chant to Torah at the conference. It went smoothly even though the lectern was higher than ours and I had to chant on my tiptoes.

We talked about healthy eating with Dr. Roxanne Sukol, did some yoga, learned about creating our own Congregational Arts Program, listened to music that was written for a Jazz Shabbat Service, and toured the Maltz Museum next door to The Temple-Tifereth Israel.

We sang along with the music of 5 composers, who each gave us 5 pieces of their performed music. (Yes, that's 25 new pieces of music!...but don't worry, I won't introduce you to all of them.)

We celebrated 70 years of Israel, 36 years of WCN, a member becoming a Bat Mitzvah, and mikvah ceremony for a soon to be bride from WCN. We also talked about the Changing Face of Judaism, emphasis on face and talked about connecting to the mental health community.

I even learned how to digitize my music to use on the bimah and came back with a WCN Board position. I'm now their Recording Secretary and will help on the committee for next year's conference in Morris Plains, New Jersey. It was a lovely, educational, conference.


