Rabbi's Message Marc Ekstrand

Friends,

Rabbi Dalia Marx begins the preface to her recent book, **From Time to Time: Journeys in the**

Jewish Calendar,

"What is time? What is this slippery, uncontrollable element in our lives? The things that sometimes flies at top speed and sometimes refuses to budge? The thing that moves babies to start turning over on their bellies, sit up, stand, and grow into children, that causes the young to grow tall and adds the graceful touch of silver hair to older people? How can we define the constant, inscrutable flow that we call 'time'?"

Human experience unfolds along threads of time. Every culture attempts to address and respond to Marx's opening questions, not scientifically but emotionally, transforming seconds, minutes, and hours into meaningful moments. In this new book, Rabbi Marx leads us through the months of the Hebrew calendar, elucidating ancient and modern texts and traditions to reveal each month's unique character. Her opening questions foreshadow a presentation of a Jewish accounting of time that I find inspiring, accessible, and personal.

I was a student of Rabbi Marx at Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in Jerusalem. Through her lectures and teaching style, I developed a deep love for Jewish liturgy. She taught in such a way that I believed I could hear the voices and feel the emotions of those who first extemporaneously spoke the prayers now fixed on the pages of our siddur. One of the most challenging aspects of prayer is developing one's unique prayer voice. This is the voice that we speak, and God hears when prayers leave our minds and mouths. Rabbi Marx's teachings have been a central influence in developing my inner prayer voice.

It was a sweet surprise to find the foreword written by Rabbi David Ellenson, z"l. Rabbi Ellenson died on December 10, 2023. He taught at HUC-JIR for forty years and was president for 12 years. You can read his obitu-

ary in the New York Times. I had precious few encounters with Rabbi Ellenson. What stood out to me about him was that he was engaged emotionally and intellectually in every moment. It was clear that he always spoke from the heart and cared deeply about those he spoke to.

In his foreword, Rabbi Ellenson tells us why we should give the time of day to one more book about Jewish holidays and seasons added to the pile. That reason is Dalia Marx – a tenth-generation Israeli, ordained at HUC-JIR in both Jerusalem and Cincinnati, earned a doctorate in Jewish liturgy at Hebrew University, prolific author, and lecturer, writing and speaking in Hebrew, English, German, and Spanish, chief editor of the new Israeli Reform prayerbook, T'filat HaAdam. Ellenson writes that this book "in many ways expresses and captures the most noble ambitions that informed both religious and cultural Zionism... represents the highest hopes both Rav Kook and Ahad HaAm had for the Zionist enterprise. Rav Kook dreamt of Jewish national renewal in religious terms and believed that a newborn Zion is where the 'old would be renewed and the new would be made holy.' Contemplating this religious vision was the notion Achad HaAm put forth that the future Zion would be a merkaz ruchani, a spiritual center that would facilitate the revival of Jewish culture in Israel and breathe life into Jewish existence in the Diaspora." Rabbi Dalia Marx is an authentic voice speaking traditions old and new from the spiritual center of Am Yisrael.

Each chapter of From Time to Time begins with a kavanah or prayer, an introduction to the month, and poems from classical or modern sources before beginning her presentation and commentary on the religious and secular sources that give each month its unique character. Although you may be familiar with some of what Marx presents, you will find her work new and authentic. I highly recommend From Time to Time. I doubt it will make it onto your bookshelf. You will want to keep it nearby to ground yourself and breathe new life into Jewish time. From Time to Time is available now from the CCAR Press –

It's now 2024. We are halfway through the 2023-2024 fiscal year and almost one year since we asked you at our Coffee Houses for your input on how we could improve Temple life.

You said, not everything has to be a fundraiser -please come up with more frequent and less expensive group activity options. We brought back
a fun new format – the shorter service paired
with an affordable but healthier and high quality
Shabbat dinner menu. We've seen many participate because it is a relaxing way for congregants
to catch up with each other. We've offered free
adult education courses, lectures, panels, and
special presentations to expand our minds and
cultural outlook.

You also said one Shabbat time does not fit all so we offered options. We've seen an increase in attendance due to the earlier 6:30 start during the first and second weeks, but the shorter 6:00 service before the dinners during the third week brings in a different crowd, and the 7:30 service during the fourth week brings in those who prefer to first enjoy Shabbat dinner at home.

And you said, how about setting up some smaller groups to cultivate more quality interactions? Great idea. Our community circles are catching on. More and more people are gathering at Temple to play drop-in mahjongg on a regular basis. They're in the social hall and the library on Wednesday and Sunday afternoons. Once a month writers are sharing their stories and discussing planned works. The committees are meeting in the social hall on Sunday mornings again. And we tried line dancing after a New Year's Themed Shabbat service.

Our clergy, professional staff, and lay leaders listened. We're trying new things and we're making a great deal of progress in energizing and invigorating our community.

Our Temple has seen a huge uptick in attendance at recent events, so we are grateful to be able to

better afford private security details to help monitor our grounds during our programming. Thank you to all who are continuing to support the Security Fund.

Over 80 people attended the Chanukah Shabbat service and families enjoyed lighting their own Chanukiyot together. Special thanks to Rabbi Marc, Hazzan Sherry, and the Temple Band for their extra ruach. Thank you to our Religious School Director Lisa Marcus, Amy Orce, Jennifer Zettler, and the Religious School Committee for coordinating a special Chanukah celebration, which included visiting students and parents from the religious school of Congregation B'nai Israel. And many thanks to Mike Reinhard and the men of Brotherhood who once again cooked a delicious Brisket & Latke Dinner and fed over 110 people in attendance!

Thank you to Jo Michaelson for coordinating the super interesting and entertaining Mohegan Tribal Cultural Presentation by Tradition Specialist David Eichelberg.

Congratulations to all the winners of the Temple's Annual Raffle! It was exciting to see our Young Israeli Emissaries randomly select the winning tickets and to hear John Murphy announce the winners' names. It had been a while since so many winners were present at the Brisket & Latke dinner.

This month, Hazzan Sherry and I will be very busy watching the auditions of Cabaret Acts (music, singing, comedy, dance, and/or literary readings and more) as we plan our 9th Annual Cabaret Night for Saturday, February 3 at 7:00 p.m. It will be another fantastic evening of Temple friends gathering for appetizers, Havdalah, a variety show, and dessert. The snow date is for the following Saturday, February 10.




